Children in Need- well done everyone, it was great to have fun and raise money for a good cause. Your non-uniform donations raised £153.76 which we have paid to Children in Need.

Our poppy appeal this year was also very successful-we sold out in just a few days. The Royal British Legion will let us know how much we raised.

Our fundraising hampers have been given to the winning families, this raised £386 for the school fund account, we are using this money to buy more toys and equipment for the children to use on the playground at lunchtimes. Aila Marku in 1C won the children's hamper and Vishwak Suravaram in 3A won the adult hamper.

## Staffing

You may have noticed some unfamiliar faces lately in school. We have had the highest levels of staff sickness since COVID over the past few weeks. This means we rely on agency staff to teach and provide support to children. Whilst this is not ideal, as the staff don't know your children as well as our regular staff, the Manford staff have ensured that your children are still being taught the curriculum and their needs are being met. I am very relieved that we have not had to send classes home and go back to Google Classroom remote learning-we have been close to doing this over the last couple of weeks.

## Childcare

A survey will be coming out to you next week about our childcare offer (after school and breakfast clubs). Since COVID it seems families in our area need less childcare. Our numbers attending the childcare clubs has remained low-we predict that in the current financial year we will make a loss of around £19,000. Obviously, we can't sustain this so we have a number of options:

- Put the prices up
- Stay open until 6pm so that more families can use the childcare after school
- Close the childcare clubs and signpost families to other facilities

I hope that we can continue with the childcare as I know some families rely on it-please respond to the survey next week to help Governors make a decision moving forward.
