English


Writing: Explanation text, descriptive writing and formal letter. Your child will receive weekly spelling lists to learn.

Children will continue to learn to use the full range of punctuation taught at Key Stage 2 (e.g. semi-colons, dashes, colons, hyphens).

Children will learn to use different verb forms and different levels of formality.

Children will learn to write cohesively, structuring their written work in paragraphs.

Maths

This term we will continue to consolidate a variety of number and calculation methods/strategies.



We will also revisit and progress our fractions knowledge, as well as measures.

Science

Children will learn about evolution and inheritance. They will study fossil formation, the structure of cells and look at evolution.
