

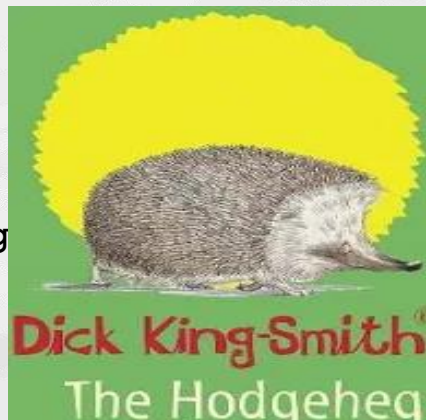
Summer One in Year 2

English

This term, children will explore the book *Fox* to build reading fluency and deepen comprehension. They will discuss characters, sequence events, infer meaning, and express ideas confidently.

They will also be reading their first chapter book. They will discuss characters' motivations, identify key events, and make predictions. Through writing activities, children will practise sequencing, describing settings, and expressing opinions.

We are reading...



Maths

Fractions – learning to recognise equal parts of the whole and finding fractions of number – focusing on $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{2}{4}$, $\frac{3}{4}$.

Time – Children will learn how to read and write the time to the nearest 5 and 15 minutes using an analogue clock.

Science

Plants – Children will be exploring a variety of seeds and bulbs. They will learn that bulbs store energy inside them and they will be looking at how seeds germinate over time. They will also carry out an experiment to find out which conditions are best for plants to grow in.



Art

Pointillism

We will be looking at Pointillism by the famous Impressionist artist George Seurat. We will look at some of his inspiring pieces such as 'A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte' and using his unique style to create our own Pointillism images. We will also be colour mixing and creating different shades and tones.



Geography

Hot & Cold places- Africa & the Arctic

Children will learn to identify seasonal and daily weather patterns in the United Kingdom and the location of hot and cold areas of the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Pole. They will use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to the key physical and human features. They will use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries.



RE

Islam

The children will be retelling stories about the prophet and looking closely at artefacts used during prayer. They will discuss the significance of important religious festivals and how they support and underpin belief.



Music

Structure – Myths and Legends

The children will learn to recognise, play and write rhythms using one beat and paired half beat patterns. They will show rests through movement, follow structures from left to right, and create simple compositions. Children will work collaboratively to maintain a steady beat.



PSHE

Relationships

Children will learn what makes a family. We will draw links to previous learning that a family is what you make it. They will explore what is needed for a happy family and how to solve conflict when it happens.

Computing

The children will be taught a variety of forms to present their work digitally. Children will learn to collect, organise and present data and information in digital content. They will be able to make improvements to solutions based on feedback received by their peers.



PE

Athletics and Football

Children will be refining running, throwing, catching, dribbling and strike skills. They will be combining these skills to focus on small group games such as Target Throwing, Ball Relay along with playing friendly football matches and learning the importance of good sportsmanship in games.
